% Student and School Access

Nearly 97% of all students enrolled have access to arts instruction in schools while 86% of schools reported offering at students on Free and Reduced Lunch (FRPL). Low FRPL schools least one arts course. 39% of students are enrolled in an arts course. However, only 25% of all students and 12% of all schools offer the required four arts disciplines.




